They now go on to the next major step of their lives and all of us here at BSL know they are prepared and will do well. Live long and prosper and keep in touch!


The Prelude to Graduation

BSL secondary students perform 'We are the World' to a packed audience!






Stage Invasion! BSL Teachers and students perform an uplifting version of 'Let it go' at our prelude to graduation!

- 2. **Reduce** energy! Turn of lights and air conditioners when they are not needed.
- 3. **Reduce** the amount of paper you use. Send your work to teachers digitally to be marked! Print double sided when you print. **Reuse** paper that has only been used on one side!



Thanks to all who bought a hotdog and supported the event.




Alumni News
