We are delighted to announce that swimming lessons will commence next week according to the following schedule:

You will need to bring:

1. **swimming goggles are compulsory for protecting eyes**
2. Girls should have a **one-piece swimsuit**; boys should have **swimming trunks** (not long beach shorts).
3. Girls with long hair will need a **swimming cap** to keep their hair in place
4. A **wet bag** (or sports bag) is important to keep their belongings in.
5. A **towel** is essential.
6. Practically, **shower gel** and **bathroom slippers** (flip flops) are also essential but not compulsory.

We kindly ask parents to speak with their children about the importance of listening carefully and following safety instructions especially during swimming sessions.
