It also promotes respectful and thoughtful use of technology to foster a safer experience for us all.

This year, Safer Internet Day was on the **11th February 2025** but as a school we also marked the occasion on Monday 10th February 2025 and throughout the week. To promote Safer Internet, groups in the Year 7 class have presented a slideshow on the importance and reason why we should protect ourselves from dangers on the internet. The Year 8 class have represented this day by performing a skit showing the different ways people can scam and endanger you on the internet, also showing ways to protect yourself and keep you safe. These are different ways you can protect yourself on the internet :

• Backing up your data

Safeguard your most important data, such as your photos and key documents, by backing them up to an external hard drive or a cloud-based storage system.

• Protect your accounts by using strong passwords

Cyber criminals can use your email to access many of your personal accounts, leaving you vulnerable to identity theft.

• Keep your personal information, personal!

Hackers can use social media profiles to figure out your passwords and answer those security questions in the password reset tools. Lockdown your privacy settings and avoid posting things like birthdays, addresses, mother's name, etc. Be wary of requests to connect with people you do not know.
