The Shanghai Maths Project has been adopted by numerous schools outside the UK, particularly in countries looking to improve their mathematics teaching methods. The project has gained significant traction globally, with schools in the United States, Canada, Australia, and various European nations implementing Shanghai Maths principles and resources. BSL is the first school in Togo and among the few schools in Africa to initiate this invaluable resource.

Our Shanghai Maths books are appreciated by our students; Rokhaya in Year 6 finds them "challenging but fun, with lots of real-life problems to solve."

PUPIL ATTITUDES TO SELF AND SCHOOL (PASS) SURVEY



We will soon be conducting a school-wide student survey using the Pupil Attitudes to Self and School (PASS) measure. PASS removes the guesswork from understanding why pupils may be reluctant, disengaged, or even disruptive learners by sensitively exploring social and emotional wellbeing. It also provides interventions and guidance so you can start addressing issues immediately.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Schools consistently report that PASS identifies children who might otherwise have been overlooked for extra pastoral support.
- It takes just 20 minutes to administer.
- Delivers easy-to-read traffic light reports highlighting where action is recommended.

- Includes 70 ready-made interventions, applicable at the whole school, class, group, and individual levels.
- Nearly two million PASS assessments have been completed over the last five years.

According to Nicola Lambros, Director of Education at UK Cognita Schools, "PASS is a powerful tool because it measures the impact our school climate and culture are having on the development of our children. It tells us how our school climate and culture are making our children feel about themselves as learners and individuals."

Have you joined ClassDojo yet? Have you used it to communicate or look at your child's work?

In BSL Primary School we use ClassDojo as our main way to communicate with our parents. ClassDojo is a free App. for smartphones and tablets as well as a website that "connects teachers with students and parents to build amazing classroom communities." The App aims to give students a voice, share moments with parents, and create a positive culture in the classroom. Teachers have the ability to give students digital high-fives or reward students with points for a job well done, and parents can get immediate feedback on the projects their child worked on in class or their child's behavioural needs.
